











MSc (Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery)

The department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery is well recognised as a centre of excellence for research in the fields of 3D imaging and bone bioengineering. These special interests in the surgical specialties are linked with the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgical service in the city and regional hospitals in the West of Scotland. The University of Glasgow Dental School is the second largest in the UK providing undergraduate and postgraduate education.

Aims

- The course will provide students with a thorough understanding of the basic principles of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. The students will have a unique opportunity to regularly perform minor oral surgery procedures under supervision, assist in orthognathic & grafting procedures, and take part in outpatient consultant clinics.
- The clinical component of the programme has been accredited by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow as satisfactory for sitting the final part of the MFDS examination.
- The research component will allow for the development of basic skills in structuring and implementing research in the field of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Programme Structure

The MSc (Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery) is a full-time two year programme which has three components:

Core Course 60 credits. Consisting of Basic Sciences (20 credits), Health Sciences, (20 credits) and Research Sciences (20 credits) **Clinical Component** 200 credits. Dedicated to didactic teaching, reflective learning, clinical procedures and hands-on training in Oral Surgery and

Research Component 100 credits. Students will be encouraged to carry out a concise research project using existing facilities within the well-established research themes of the Biotechnology and Craniofacial Sciences Research Group.

Entrance Requirements

Dental Implantology.

Applicants should have a universally recognised dental qualification and proof of proficiency in English language achieved within the two years prior to application. Normally, this would be the British Council IELTS, minimal score 6.5 with no less than 6 in any sub-skill, or the equivalent.

Fees:

The international clinical fee for 2011–12 has not been decided. The international clinical fee for session 2010-11 was £29,600 per annum and this may be subject to inflation for 2011-12.
